INAUGURAL LINCOLN HIGHWAY FUN RUN A HUGE SUCCESS

At dawn on October 1, Clarksville Region Historical Society members and student volunteers from Oak Ridge High School met at EDH Natural Farms for the Society's first Annual 8K Fun Run.

The event was made possible through the generous support of Serrano Associates LLC, MJM Properties LLC, and The Nagle Company.

By 8:00 o'clock, runners, joggers and walkers had checked in and were awaiting the starting gun at the old bridge on Old Bass Lake Road, which is actually the old Lincoln Highway.

The Lincoln Highway was built early in the last century and was the first continuous transcontinental automobile highway.

The run followed the route of the original eight-foot-wide concrete pavement, which was laid down sometime in the 1920s, and where one can still see evidence of the center white line.

The pictures tell the story better than any narrative. The Second Run will take place about the same time in 2017. ~
